Objectives

- ◆ Present and compare the 4 main models of organisation: Direct awarding, deregulation, route tendering and network tendering including the roles and competences of various actors, risks and responsibilities sharing between authority and operator, quality incentives in contracts, etc.;
- Discuss lessons learnt from these models of organisation: success factors and limitations;
- Have a better understanding of the implementation of Regulation 1370/2007 on public passenger transport services by rail and by road.
